- (c) Irrigation It is done because water is essential for the plants to grow.
- (d) Weeding Weeds must be removed as they retard the growth of the main crop. (e) Spraying pesticides Farmers need to protect the crops from pests and diseases. Pesticides and insecticides are sprayed to kill insects and pests.
- (f) Winnowing The threshed grains are made to fall from a certain height to separate the husk from grains.
